

REGULATORY RESTRICTIONS and drought have cut water supplies to farms and 25 million Californians

2009: Federal Central Valley Project deliveries: 10-15% to ag; 60-65% to homes and businesses; 100% to refugees

2009: State Water Project deliveries: 30% to farms, homes and businesses

2008/2009: Nearly 1 million acre-feet lost to Delta smelt court ruling; enough water for more than 7 million people

Since 1991: Nearly 3 million acre-feet annually diverted from farms, homes and businesses to the environment

25,420 CENTRAL VALLEY WORKERS face unemployment in 2009 due to water cuts*

Up to 1 million farm acres will not receive water in 2009 from State and federal water projects

Economic impacts*

Statewide income loss.....	\$877 million
Central Valley income loss.....	\$691 million
Central Valley farm revenue loss.....	\$511 million
Central Valley groundwater costs.....	\$283 million

IT'S TIME TO FIX California's broken water system before it's too late

1962: State Water Project begins water delivery

1962: California population reaches 17 million

2008: California population tops 38 million

2030: California projected population is 49 million

- **Environmental regulations** that limit water deliveries from the Delta to farms, homes and businesses must be revised
- **A new Delta conveyance system** to provide a reliable, environmentally-safe water supply must be built
- **An increase** in surface and in-ground water storage must be achieved
